Introduction

This register provides a complete listing of New South Wales members of the National Party of Australia and its precursors, the Progressive Party, the Australian Country Party and the National Country Party, who served in the Commonwealth Parliament during the period 1901-2007 and identifies the location(s) of their private records deposited in publicly accessible archives or library manuscript collections.

Private records are defined here as records of non-governmental provenance. They are records created and maintained by, or on behalf of, individual members of parliament. They are sometimes described as 'personal archives' to distinguish them from official records created and maintained during the tenure of ministerial office. However, private records of parliamentarians frequently include not only personal records, but family, business and professional records. The precise mix varies from individual to individual, but the largest deposits of private records derive from members' constituency offices, party office-holding, activities as shadow ministers, involvement in lobby or interest groups, and conduct of business enterprises (often family pastoral companies and sometimes small businesses). The range of formats is consequently diverse, embracing subject and correspondence files, engagement books (but rarely diaries), drafts of speeches and articles, reports, media releases, newspaper cuttings books, photographs, audio and video recordings, ephemera (such as invitations, programs and pamphlets), and in some instances personal websites (archived by the National Library of Australia's PANDORA project).

Distributed custody of private records is very common in Australia. Sir Earle Page is perhaps exceptional because of the sheer quantity of records he accumulated during a 42 year parliamentary career, but the distribution of his records between the National Library of Australia, the National Archives of Australia, the Australian War Memorial and the University of New England and Regional Archives is entirely characteristic of a long-serving member who enjoyed extended periods of high ministerial office.

Some explanation is required about the format of entries in this register. The key concern is to document the locations of deposits of private records in public repositories. For this reason, only summary personal details are supplied and the user is referred to the relevant directory, register or biographical dictionary for additional information. In this present register, the term 'records' has been broadly construed to include 'biography' (that is, newspaper cuttings) files and oral histories created and maintained by the National Library and photographic or other portraits, especially when reproductions of them are available on-line. For many members there appear to be no extant records in either public or private (family) custody. But the use of the notation **NRL** (no records located) is intended simply to signal that no records have been located in **public** custody.

Readers wishing to examine these records should note that many of the accessions are restricted and some are closed to public access. Others are held in offsite storage and may take several days to retrieve. For these reasons it is essential to contact the respective archive or manuscript library well in advance of any intended visit.
